She has worked with individuals who tend to be the most vulnerable populations in society's at-risk youth, developmentally delayed individuals, those with substance abuse disorders, mental health issues, and chronically homeless women. Mrs. Brunson has utilized her leadership and communication skills with the ability to develop programs to oversee social service programs effectively and efficiently. She is a proven leader that has successfully overseen and managed the fiscal and operational components of programs to ensure that clients receive outstanding customer service.

Mrs. Brunson is the President & Chief Executive Officer at N Street Village, the largest provider of women's services in the District of Columbia focused on trauma-informed shelter and permanent supportive housing. Previously, Kenyatta was the Chief Program Officer at N Street Village, she was responsible for overseeing program operations, program development, and program outcomes for N Street Village's ten residential programs that have served over 700 women and 52 families, and non-residential programs, which serve over 2,000 women each year. She directly supervised a program leadership team of eight employees and led a program department of nearly 100 FT and PT employees.

Kenyatta along with her team ensured coordinated program delivery, quality control and program improvement, adherence to best clinical service practices, and team management and development. Kenyatta also represents N Street Village in selected citywide coordination groups around homeless services. As a proven leader in issues for women that are homeless, Mrs. Brunson has been an outspoken advocate about her concerns related to women experiencing homelessness by being interviewed on Fox 5 News, ABC 4 News, and the highlight of her career was being interviewed by Anderson Cooper on CNN when the Pope came to visit Washington, DC in 2015, and visited with those individuals experiencing homelessness who were living in shelters operated by the Archdiocese of Washington.

Mrs. Brunson had the privilege of being a featured speaker at the National Alliance to End Homelessness, National Conference for Individuals. Mrs. Brunson has

been awarded the Community Champion Award from Capital One Bank, was featured in Essence Magazine as the first runner up for the Hardest Black Woman Award, and the Empowering Woman Award from YWCA. Mrs. Brunson's other passion is investing in staff development and believes in coaching and providing opportunities for professional growth. Kenyatta has a Bachelor of Science in Applied Psychology from Coppin State University and a Master of Science in Administration (MSA) from Trinity Washington University where her concentration was Nonprofit Management.
